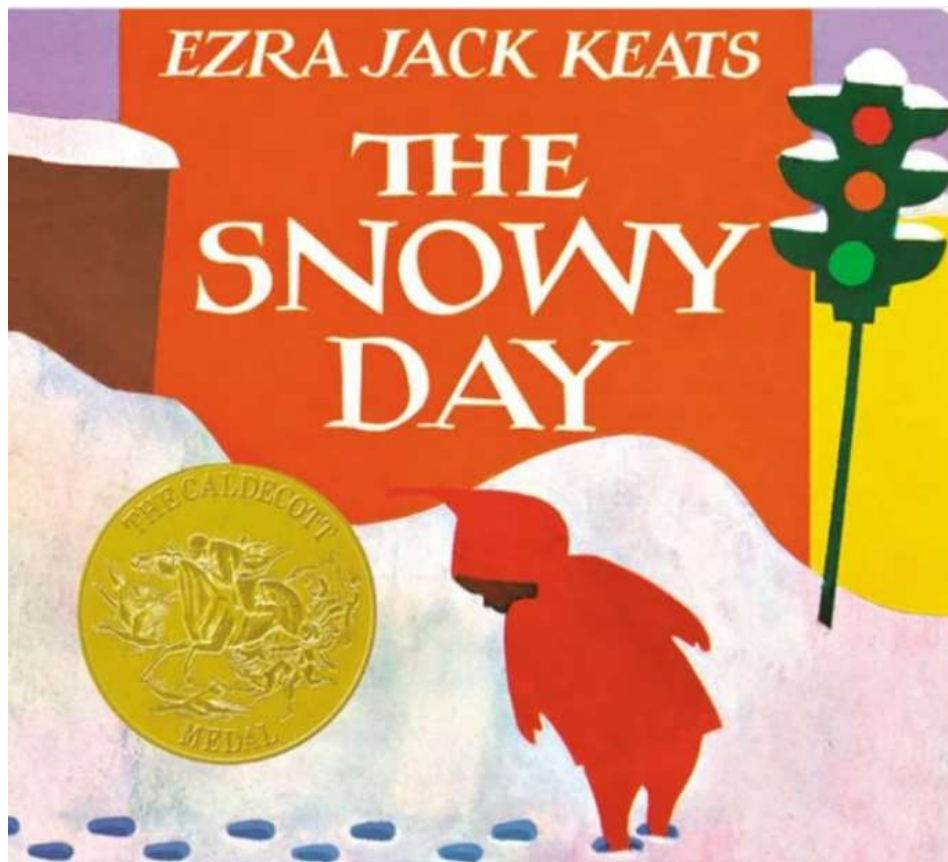
The snow provides a wonderful sensory experience- feeling the crunch under your feet and the cold on your hands. And everything looks so different!

Can you build a snowman?

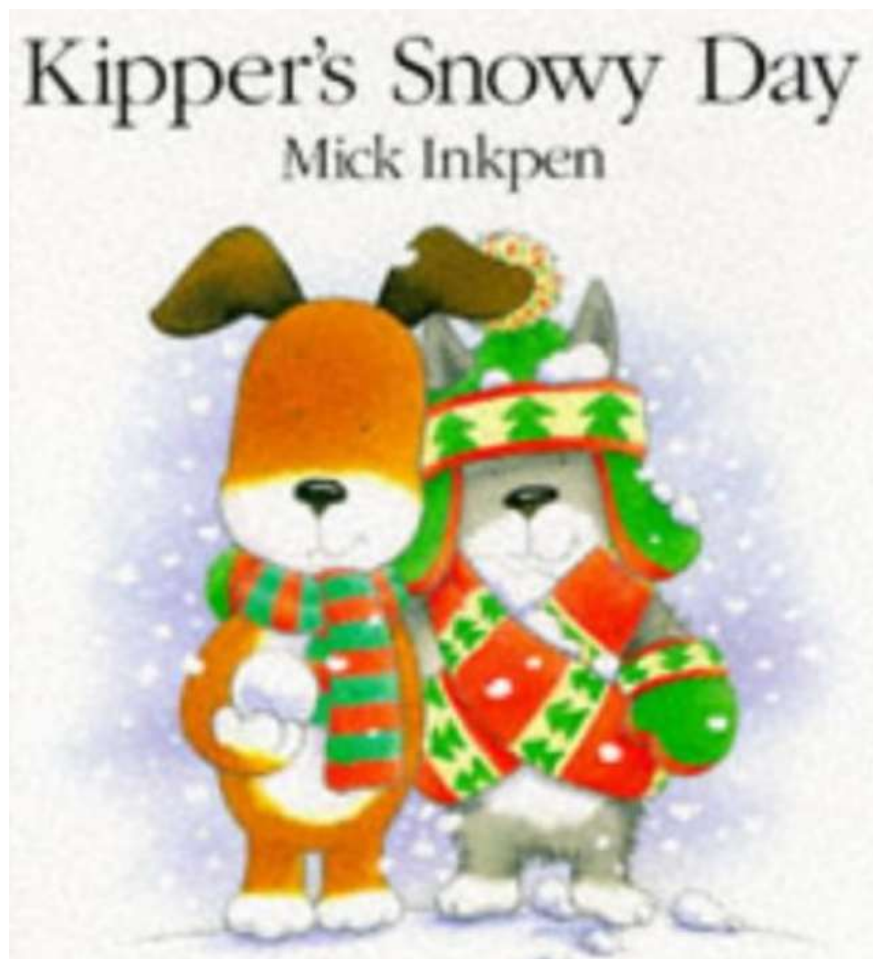
Can you throw a snowball?
