


### 1 Wash wash wash your hands!




# 7. Sock puppet -Here's another creative idea from Miss Suter.

You could make a sock puppet using an old sock, stick some googly eyes on or sew some buttons on to make eyes, you could use wool, string or scraps of paper for hair.




#### 8. Stories about Coronavirus


